Speakers earn 10 PDUs under Category Two as "Speaker on a project management topic at a conference, Symposium, or workshop".

Facilitators earn 5 PDUs for a session between 1/2 hour to an hour in duration under Category Two as "Member or moderator of a project management panel discussion at a conference, Symposium, or workshop".

Project Managers organising the seminars would earn 5 PDUs. The Project Managers would be committee members of the "Seminar Programme Committee" and

under Category Five of the PDP, each committee member would earn 5 PDUs per year for their participation, regardless of the duration of service.

> The Project Management Professional Society of Greater Vancouver organizes

- > a professional development seminar where PMPs in the area meet for a day
- > in a conference setting to engage in structured project management
- > learning. PDUs earned by audience participant are clear but other
- > participants PDUs are not clear. Please respond to following questions so
- > I can report the earned PDUs correctly.
- > 1. How many PDUs do presenters earn? Is the professional development day
- > similar to a conference, symposium or workshop so the presenter earns 10
- > PDUs? We think that 10 should be earned since the setting is more advanced
- > than a Chapter meeting.

Yes, speakers would each earn 10 PDUs under Category Two as "Speaker on a project management topic at a conference, Symposium, or workshop".

- > 2. At the last professional development day we found that it would be
- > better to promote more discussion with the audience for some of the
- > topics. After some of the presentations there was lots of discussion but
- > others had very little discussion. We have experienced facilitators lead
- > the after presentation discussion. Does the facilitator earn additional
- > PDUs? If so how many?

If they are not the same person as the presenter, and the duration is reasonable (say at least a 1/2 hour to an hour), they may be able to earn 5 PDUs under Category Two as "Member or moderator of a project management panel discussion at a conference, Symposium, or workshop".

- > 3. We have a project manager organizing this professional development
- > day. Can he claim PDU for service to a professional organization even
- > though his service term is less than a year? In other words can we divide
- > the 5 PDUs per year that can be claimed by people serving on committees or
- > task forces of a professional organization between more that one person?

Under Category Five of the PDP, each committee member would earn 5 PDUs per year for their participation, regardless of the duration of service.
